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## **CHAPTER 1:        BACKGROUND**

### **1.0     Introduction**

The Medium Term Expenditure Framework (MTEF) is a three-year financial rolling plan in which the first year translates into the annual budget. The key objective of the MTEF is to establish a link between the policies of the national and county agenda and the outputs envisaged and the budget allocations. Under the MTEF process, the emphasis is on a bottom up approach whereby the beneficiaries are consulted on their needs and priorities which are costed and sequenced for budgeting. The consultations ensure that the needs fit within the resource constraints and that they are fully funded.

Further, MTEF provides a guide on costing of devolved functions within the county in a manner that remedies economic disparities, through economic optimization of the resource envelope. The MTEF will ensure good governance, integrity, transparency, accountability and sustainable development as recognized in Chapter six and Article ten of the Constitution of Kenya. The constitution stipulates that members of the public have to be involved in budgeting for the expenditure by the county governments. Nairobi City County has adopted and currently using Medium Term Expenditure Framework in its budgeting. Budgeting based on MTEF has improved the efficiency of utilization of resources with regard to programs within the sectors in the county.

Nairobi City County made an invitation to the public to participate in the public hearings and ward-based public sector consultative forums for preparation of MTEF budget Financial Year 2018/2019.

The objectives of the MTEF and public hearing forums carried out in the County includes;

- Obtaining issues and proposals from the public to be included in the final county budget estimates of FY 2018/2019.
- Providing information to help members of the public to understand the plans the various sectors have put in place over the medium term.
- Obtain feedback from the public on the proposed alternatives for decision making.
- Ensuring that concerns by the members of the public are considered throughout the budget decision making process, particularly in the development of decision criteria options.
- Ensuring that sector allocations reflect aspirations of the public.
- Collaborating with the public to develop decision criteria and alternatives and identify the preferred solution.
- Empowering the public by placing final decision making authority in their hands.

## **1.1 Content**

This report gives development challenges/issues members of the public face together with their suggested proposed projects or actions to address them that should be included in the Financial Year 2018/2019 budget and future plans.

This report entails: the legal framework of the exercise as outlined by the constitution; the methodology that was used to obtain the data from the members of the public; findings obtained from public hearings at Charter Hall and from each ward. The findings were categorized in terms of the various County sectors to enable ease of use of this document by the various stakeholders. Finally, the report gives a brief conclusion based on the findings of the public participation exercise.



## 1.2 Legal framework

The Constitution makes citizen participation a central part of Kenya's governance system. Participation of the people is recognized in Article 10 of the Constitution of Kenya as one of our national values and principles of governance.

Further Article 174(c) provides that the object of devolution is to: **“Enhance the participation of people in the exercise of the powers of the State and in making decisions affecting them.”**

Article 184 (1) (c) also requires that mechanisms for participation by residents be included in the national legislation relating to urban areas and cities governance and management. The centrality of public participation cannot therefore be over-emphasized.

The MTEF consultation meetings as part of the county government budgeting process were prepared in accordance with the Public Financial Management Act (PFMA) and County Government Act (CGA). PFMA section 125(2) provides that the county executive committee for finance shall ensure that there is public participation in the budget process. The CGA provides for public participation in county planning in section 115(1). The act stipulates that public participation in the county planning process shall be mandatory and be facilitated through:-

- (a) Mechanisms provided for in part IV of CGA
- (b) Provision to the public of clear and unambiguous information of any matter under consideration in the planning process, including:-
  - (i) Clear strategic environmental assessments
  - (ii) Clear environment impact assessment reports
  - (iii) Expected development outcomes; and
  - (iv) Development options and their cost implementation

## **CHAPTER 2: METHODOLOGY OF THE CONSULTATIVE PROCESS**

### **2.0 Advertisements**

An advert inviting the public for the Public consultation forums at ward level was placed on the newspaper on the month of November 2017. It was followed by printing of posters of the same advert distributed to every ward through the ward administrator's offices. The advert outlined the dates and venues where the meetings were to be held in all the 85 wards. Formal communication was also made through a letter to all the ward administrators to assist in mobilization of the public and to ensure the selected venue for the exercise was ready to host the forum on the specified date and time.

### **2.1 Target Population**

The target population for the MTEF exercise were the residents of Nairobi City County, the rate payers, any resident civic organization or non-governmental, private sector or labour organization with an interest in the governance of Nairobi City County. It also targeted non-resident persons who because of their temporary presence in the city make use of services or facilities provided by the county. It is in this respect that the public participation exercise targeted close to four million inhabitants of Nairobi. However, due to various engagements of the residents, only a small fraction of this number attended the meetings. Nevertheless, there was adequate representative for the exercise. The number who attended the public participation meetings ranged from 15 - 100 people in each ward.

### **2.2 Number of Wards**

There are 85 wards in Nairobi City County. Each of these wards falls under one of 17 sub-counties.

### **2.3 Team Composition**

To cover the 85 wards, 5 teams were formed each comprising 5 members and a driver. Members in each team were drawn from various departments in the county; mainly Finance and Economic Planning, Engineering, Education and Social services.

### **2.4 Focus Group Discussion**

During public hearings each sector presented to the members of the public the budget priorities for the financial years 2018/2019 and the medium term. Rapporteurs from the sectors and Finance and Economic Planning were taking notes and recording issues raised.

In ward-based public consultative forums, each team was tasked with the responsibility of conducting two focus group discussions in a day, one in the morning and the other in the afternoon during ward-based consultative forums. Each team comprised a team leader whose responsibility was to chair the discussions, a rapporteur who was tasked with the responsibility of taking notes and recording all the issues that were discussed and three other members who were to offer guidance to the public more so in their areas of expertise.

Each discussion began with introductions by the team members who served as the facilitators, depending on their number, the public were also given an opportunity to introduce themselves. The team leaders of each team then took charge and began by explaining the reason for conducting the exercise and the importance of public participation in the budgeting process. The team leader went on to explain the mandate of the county government outlining the various responsibilities of the county government and an overview of their implementation through the County sectors.

The floor was then opened to the public to raise any queries or comments which were mostly in regard to the projects they gave in the previous exercise and the status of those within their wards that were included in the budget. The discussions for projects for financial year 2017/2018 then kicked off with the team leader guiding the discussions. These involved members of the public giving their challenges/issues and proposing projects that they want the Nairobi City County to implement to tackle these challenges. This took place systematically by dealing with each sector at a time. The public were then asked to rank the projects in order of their priority so that urgency should be given to certain projects where funds were not available to finance all the projects.

The meetings concluded with the public giving remarks and expressing their views on various issues. Two members of the public were then asked to volunteer to act as representatives of the rest by signing on the sector information sheets and hence acting as witnesses that what was recorded was the true account of the discussions that took place during the meetings.

## CHAPTER THREE: FINDINGS OF MTEF 2018/2019

### 3.1 ISSUES RAISED DURING PUBLIC HEARINGS ON THE 2018/2019 BUDGET ESTIMATES

## 3.2 SUMMARY OF ISSUES RAISED DURING WARD-BASED CONSULTATIVE FORUMS

### 3.2.1 HEALTH SECTOR

- Lack of Public health Centers in the wards.
- No maternal services & equipment e.g. Macerator in most health centers in wards.
- Insecurity in public health facilities due to no perimeter fencing and gates.
- Lack of ambulance services within some wards.
- No facilitation for community health workers e.g. Protective garments and equipment like nose masks and gloves, for them.
- Increased prevalence of communicable and infectious diseases e.g. Tuberculosis and HIV/AIDS.
- Poor health service delivery due to inadequate skilled personnel and equipment.
- Lack of medical facilities, and skilled practitioners for patients with Non-communicable diseases (NCDs) e.g. Cancer, Diabetes, Heart & respiratory diseases, disorders, etc.
- No incinerators in some of the health centers.

- Insufficient Laboratories and laboratory equipment e.g. Reagents etc.
- Inadequate supply of drugs in health centers in the wards.
- Difficulties in accessing facilities
- Lack of Power-backup generators, clean water, toilets in health centers in the wards.
- Congestion in available health facilities within the wards.

### **3.2.2 ROADS, TRANSPORT, PUBLIC WORKS AND INFRASTRUCTURE**

- Poor state of access roads due to lack of maintenance within the wards.
- Nonfunctional Street lights within the ward.
- Rising cases of insecurity due to inadequate street lighting along the roads.
- Lack of motor-able and non-motor-able bridges connecting areas with water bodies such, rivers and streams.
- Lack of road signage and bumps in some wards.
- Poorly-maintained drainage systems especially, after construction of roads.
- Narrow drainage systems leading to overflow and flooding.
- Abandonment of roads construction projects, leading to incompleteness of roads, even after scheduled duration.
- No designated bus stops/ laybys for vehicles.
- Lack of pedestrian walkways on some roads within the wards.
- Lack of Boda Boda shades.

### **3.2.3 WATER, ENVIRONMENT, ENERGY AND NATURAL RESOURCES.**

- Inadequacy and limited accessibility to clean and fresh water.
- Damaged water pipes, limiting access to water.
- Insufficient sanitation facilities in the ward e.g. Public toilets.
- Narrow sewer lines that occasionally burst.
- No utilization of open spaces for example, by tree-planting, establishment of leisure gardens.
- Poor waste management protocols e.g. No garbage collection points, No dumping sites, no garbage loading trucks, etc.
- No consideration for recycling plants at garbage holding grounds.
- Poor sewer line-connections within the wards, leading to environmental pollution, as a result of drainage into the rivers and other facilities.

### **3.2.4 EDUCATION, YOUTH AFFAIRS, CHILDREN, SPORTS&CULTURE AND SOCIAL SERVICES**

- Lack of Early Child Development (ECD) Centers in the wards.
- No Resource Centers in the wards.
- No Social Hall for public meetings, for youth& children activities to take place in the ward.

- Rapid increase in street families and children.
- Poor state of sports ground in the ward, which need rehabilitation.
- Congestion in existing ECD centers, due to high population growth with no increase in spaces e.g. Classrooms
- Problem of drug and substance abuse among the youth.
- Poor state of Public schools in the ward, that need rehabilitation.eg. Perimeter fencing, carpeting of classrooms, sanitation facilities, etc.
- Need for adequate vocational training centers (polytechnics) for the youth.
- Unequipped training centers for the youth.
- Minimal youth empowerment and capacity building initiatives.
- Lack of income-generation schemes and job creation opportunities for the youth in the ward.
- Inadequate facilities for Special school-going children (mostly those with disabilities)
- Lack of transparency in awarding bursaries to the poor school going children.

### **3.2.5 TRADE, COMMERCE, COOPERATIVES AND TOURISM**

- No trading spaces e.g. Open-air markets, Market stalls and Modern kiosks.
- Poorly-maintained existing markets.
- Lack of youth & women empowerment on entrepreneurship and trading activities.
- No sensitization programmes for small scale traders.

### **3.2.6 GOVERNOR'S OFFICE**

- No ward administration offices in some wards.
- Lack of public sensitization and civic education, in regards to public participation forums.
- High frequency in fire outbreaks.
- No fire response centers within the wards.
- No training for disaster preparedness e.g., first aid skills, fire response.

### **3.2.7 URBAN PLANNING AND LANDS**

- Rampant cases of land grabbing, especially, of public lands set aside for public utilities.
- Lack of title deed to land owners in the wards.
- No clear demarcation of lands in the wards, especially public lands, need for audit of lands.
- Encroachment of road reserves by private developers.
- Constructions leading to destruction of other utilities e.g. Water pipes. Drainage systems, etc.
- Need to conduct an audit of all public lands.

### **3.2.8 AGRICULTURE, LIVESTOCK DEVELOPMENT, FISHERIES AND FORESTRY**

- Rising cases of stray animals in the wards.

- No provision of extension agricultural officers to aid in urban farming.
- Outbreak of diseases and discomfort in the wards due to insects e.g. Bedbugs, mosquitoes, etc.
- Unavailable agricultural facilities e.g. Fish ponds, greenhouses, poultry units to enhance urban agriculture.

### **3.2.9 PUBLIC SERVICE MANAGEMENT**

- Minimal employment and involvement of the youth in the county e.g. in casual jobs.
- Understaffing-poorly-staffed to undertake duties e.g. Doctors, teachers, cleaners etc.

### **3.2.10 URBAN RENEWAL, HOUSING AND BUILDING SERVICES**

- Poor state of County houses that require rehabilitation.

### **3.2.11 FINANCE AND ECONOMIC PLANNING**

- Lack of mechanisms to oversee, monitor and evaluate ward projects.

### **3.2.12 ICT AND E-GOVERNMENT**

- Poor management & coordination at ward level, to interact and integrate the community along with the county activities.
- Lack of ICT centers in the wards.

## **CHAPTER 4: CONCLUSION AND RECOMMENDATION**

The public participation exercise provided an opportunity for members of the public to give their proposals for projects as well as being enlightened on the functions of the county government. The public were also given update on the status of the projects they proposed and that were included in the previous financial budgets for 2015/2016, 2016/2017 and current financial budget for 2017/2018.

Members of the public were discontented at the pace of implementation of the development projects in the county. Most wards expressed great dissatisfaction especially since they had not seen any tangible development projects within their wards since the county government took over from the defunct City Council. In some cases the members of the public declined to give their views since some of them felt that it was a futile exercise since their challenges given in previous consultations have not been addressed. Some even proposed that the suggestions they gave in last financial year be replicated since their priorities have not change.

Many issues arose from the interaction with the public during the exercise but some issues were key and stood out in many of the wards visited, they include;

- Health remains a key issue and most of the public members complained of inadequate staff, drugs, laboratory and maternity services in the health facilities. The public requested that the county government invest a lot more in the health sector.
- On waste management, there were complains of piled garbage as most trucks have broken down and take long to repair. Majority of the wards proposed that the county government purchase bins or dig pits with cover at the waste collection points rather than leave the waste to spread all over that poses serious health risks.
- Most wards complained of the poor state of their feeder roads which are impassable coupled with poor or lack of drainage. Encroachment on the roads either by traders or other private structures also stood out.
- There were complaints of lack of bus stage/terminus within the estates hence frequent accidents and traffic jam.

- Lack of access to water in informal settlement areas and inadequate public toilets.
- The sewer system still remains a critical issue due to the frequent bursts and inability to handle the waste due to the high population. Most wards requested for total overhaul, expansion of the sewer system and installation of new sewer lines in areas lacking sewer line.
- Inadequate trading space also arose as a challenge and members requested for establishment of modern markets or erection of more modern kiosks.
- Although in some wards, the issue of land grabbing is still prevalent, some wards have managed to reclaim the grabbed lands with the support of their leaders and are now requesting the county government to move quick and put up development projects or even fence before they are grabbed again due to lying idle.
- For the public lands that are still in possession of the private individuals, members of the public urged the county government expedite their repossession to avail space for public amenities.
- It was also noted most wards needed the county government to continuously carry out civic education and public participation to enlighten them on their development progress and enhance better relations and decision making.

The issues raised during these forums will be consolidated on a ward and sector basis for circulation to all sector working groups for consideration during the finalization of the Sector Reports and budget estimates for FY 2018/2019.
