#### Dear Readers.

Hi all, much appreciation for your contributions following the release of the last Quarter (Jan-March 2017) bulletin. Am humbled to introduce to you this Quarter (Apr-June 2017) bulletin. As you are aware, this is the last quarter of 2016/2017 financial year. This bulletin shade light on performance across all the quarters of financial year 2016/2017. It also captures some few activities that took place in April to June 2017 in the County.

2016/2017 financial year has been affected by frequent strikes thus affecting different indicators across the health sector. In this bulletin, you will realize that some indicators have increased in the same quarter (Q1, Q2, Q3) contrary to what was presented in the previous bulletin. This follows data entry after I have extracted the data. DHIS 2 have been on and off thus late release of this bulletin.

Mother child health have been greatly affected with 4ANC visits dropping from 39.6% to 24.5% in Q2 and Q4 respectively. Fully immunized children coverage dropped from 75.4% in Q1 to 46.1% in Q4. Skilled delivery dropped from 44% in Q3 to 30.4% in Q4. Family planning from 59.9% to 32%. However , due to November 2016 and May 2017 malezi bora activities, deworming and Vitamin A supplementation increased in Q2 and Q4. Some of the APRP 2016/17 targeted indicators performance include FIC– 60%, skilled delivery – 74%, FP new cases— 96% and 4ANC visits–65%. Stay blessed.






# **Challenges Experienced this Quarter**

## Outpatient Morbidity (5 Leading cases)








The gap between 1st ANC visit and 4 ANC drastically increased across all the quarters. This is an indication that most mothers are still not completing there ANC visits as scheduled. However October to December had the highest 4 ANC visits completion at (39.6%).






### EX ASKARI SERPENT 17 MEDICAL CAMPS—AFTER ACTION REVIEW

Three medical regiment visited Samburu County to provide Health Outreach Clinics (Medical camps) from 22nd Apr 2017 – 09 May 2017. Eighteen (18) days clinics were established in Ngutuk, Lengusaka, Lerata and Laresoro. The team comprised Regiment's Doctors, Medical Technicians, Nurses and Dentists., as well as clinicians and interpreters from the Kenya Defense Force and Kenya Red Cross. Patient category 18-30 years were the most seen with URTI taking the lead in all the condition type.

EX-ASKARI SERPENT 17- EPIDEMIOLOGICAL DATA




